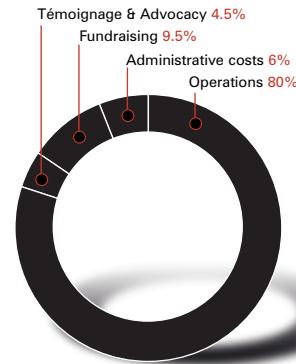


# Facts and Figures

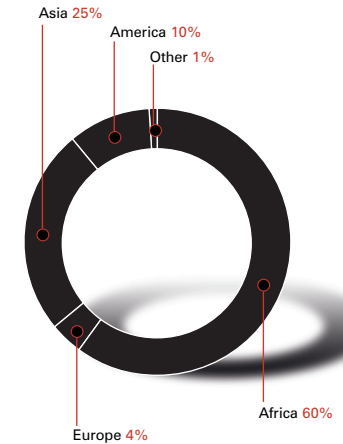
Médecins Sans Frontières is a private, non-profit, international organization. It is made up of 18 national sections in Australia, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, France, Germany, Holland, Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of China, Italy, Japan, Luxembourg, Norway, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, the United Kingdom, the United States, and an international office in Brussels. Each section of MSF publishes annual, audited financial statements according to its national legislation and auditing rules. Based on these national statements, the figures presented here provide an estimate of MSF's finances on an international level. The consolidated international figures have not been audited. The figures are for the 2000 calendar year; the Activity Report itself covers the period July 2000 through August 2001. All amounts are in millions of Euros.

Total Expenditure: 314

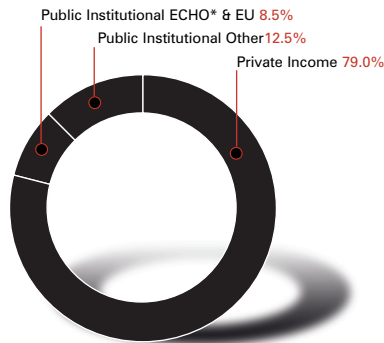


## Project expenses per continent

Total Income: 322

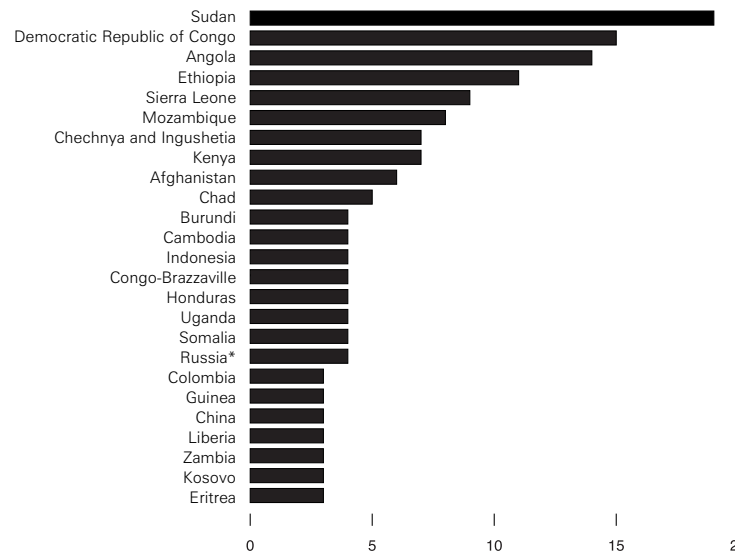

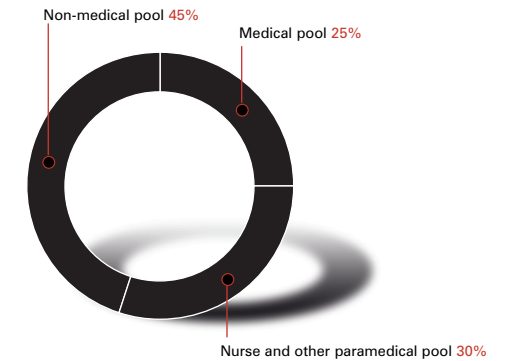
